LABOR BENEFITS BY RAISE

Mill Operatives in New England Will Reap Ten Millions in Year.

LAWRENCE WORKERS GO BACK

Fall River Unions Demanding Fif teen Per Cent Increase and Reject Offer of Five Per Cent that Has Been Made.

BOSTON, March 18.-Wage Increase aggregating more than \$10,000,000 will go into the pockets of New England textile workers during the next twelve months according to authoritative estimates of the result of the present upward trend of wages in cuton and woolen mile. On the basis of an annial pay roll of \$75,000. 000 in the woolen mills, the increase there

will amount to \$5,000,000, while cotton mill operatives will receive an advance

Pully 25,000 operatives will share to the raise by April 1 if all the mills whi have not yet joined in the movement follow the lead of large concerns. An-nouncements made already of contem-plated advances affect upward of 200,000 mill workers, while other cotton manu-facturers have indicated an intention of equalling the wage advances, but have given no definite annuncement. The New Bedford manufacturers' offer of a 5 per cent increase will be acted on early this week by the textile council, which of 10 per cent. Although there is a divi-sion of opinion among the operatives,

demand for 10 per cent when business The textile council, representing five unions of Fall River operatives, has voted to reject the offer of an advance of 5 per cent and demands 15 per cent. Nogotiations between the labor represents tives and mili agents will be continued this week. Close observers of the situation believe a compromise will be arranged. On the result in Fall River will depend in part probably the final attitude of the New Bedford unions' acceptance
