URE ASKS FOR PROTECTION

Says Comptroller Conducts Bond Sale in Unwarranted Manner.

CONGRESS BLAMES THE COUNCIL

Says Finance Committee Advised Him Not to Notify the Treasurer of the Sale of Improvement Bonds.

In a letter to the city council at its adjourned session yesterday Treasurer W. G. Ure asserted that he felt it his duty to report that in the disposal of the \$225,000 street improvement district bonds "the comptroller had conducted the sale in a most unauthorized and unwarranted manner." He asked for some protection against the finance committee and the council.
Comptroller Congrove said he sold the bonds without first notifying the treasurer or delivering them to him to give to the purchasers on the advice of the finance committee.
"In my opinion Ure wanted to delay the delivery of the bonds," said Congrove. Mr. Ure called attention to the fact

that the bonds, authorized February 26, had been held in the office of the comptroller until April 8. The purchasers have notified the city now that the money for the bonds has been placed to Omaha's credit in the city of Boston.
Contracts aggregating \$200,000 on street improvements authorized last year, but not done owing to a deficit in the street improvement funds, were approved by the council.
By unanimous vote the proposition of Woolworth avenue residents to turn over to the city an ornamental lighting system if the city would maintain it was accepted. A contract submitted by the legal department was referred to committee.
A proposition to grant the Missouri Pacific railroad right to lay a track across Twenty-fifth avenue and Twenty-sixth street and Boyd and Sahler was referred to the committee of the whole.
W. D. Marks, the expert engaged to appraise the property of the Omaha Gas company, was allowed \$1,500.00 on contract, for work performed to April 1.
Bids for the construction of the Suddie Creek sewer will be readvertised, as there was a mistake in the bids received.
K. J. Sutcliffe was allowed \$153.99 for reporting the special investigation into telephone rates.
A protest from citizens on the annual

of a strip of land held by J. W. Bedford, was referred to the street improvement committee. The protest was on the grounds that Mr. Bedford was receiving twice as much as he had paid for the property.

The highest price ever paid for cattle at the South Omaha market was commanded yesterday when the Garrow Commission company sold twenty-one head of white-face Herefords for \$2.5. The highest previous price was \$2.5, paid in June of 1910.
The cattle sold by the Garrow company averaged 1,350 pounds each, and were fed by George Luff of Unadilla, Otoe county, Nebraska, one of the oldest and best known stockmen in the west.

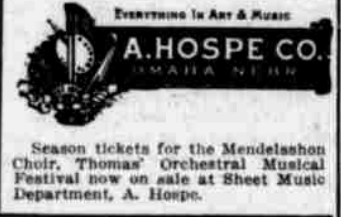
FEDERAL JURY IS BUSY WITH BOOZE PEDDLERS
