Travis Wins Tournament.

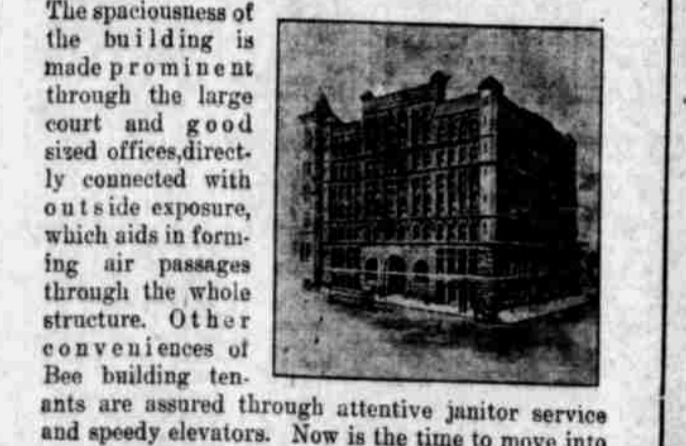
