### TREES PLACED EVERYWHERE

Entire City Celebrates Day Originated by J. Sterling Morton.

### BUSINESS WAITS ON ARBOR DAY

Shrubbery Planted by School Children and Private Citizens—Official and Business Offices Closed for Day.

Public officials, the courts and the ins. candidates, school teachers, students, private citizens and corporations united in the celebration of Arbor day. Trees were planted at dawn and the work went steadily on all day. City hall and county officials closed their doors, with the exception of the city health department and the city and county treasurer, who kept open house until late afternoon. Federal offices were closed.

**Banks Did Not Open.**

Schools kept, but the curriculum included tree-planting and the making of flower beds. Seeds of several varieties were distributed among the students, who planted them under the direction of the principals. At the high school the agriculture classes planted several dozen trees and were instructed by Miss Caroline Springer, head of the department. The history of the day was discussed.

Commercial organizations continued work, but in a few instances employees were given a number of trees of the sturdy varieties, along with instructions in forestry and lawn-making. Several thousand citizens who had received white Birch trees distributed by the J. L. Brandeis & Sons firm, arose early to plant them. Hundreds of trees had been planted about homes and public institutions before 11 o'clock.

Even candidates for commissioner submitted to the action of the voters at the polls.

### election May 7 suspended campaign plans long enough to commemorate the occasion.

"I have been putting in the day planting trees instead of building political fences," said John J. Hyder. "Planting trees is really more enjoyable than the political game, anyway. It's so free from worry."

J. Sterling Morton, founder of Arbor day, saw the day generally observed a short time after it was originated. However, it was more generally observed in Omaha today than since it was made a holiday by the legislature in Nebraska and the first Arbor day was observed, April 10, 1892.

### Repaving Viaduct to Start Shortly

The block pavement across the Sixteenth street viaduct will be taken up within the next two or three days by the railroad and repaved with concrete wooden blocks. While this is being done the street cars will run on a single track across the viaduct.

The viaduct has long been in need of repairs. The blocks in many places have been warped out of place by the rain and sun, and have obstructed both wagon and street car traffic. The railroad companies intend to have the work completed within sixty days.

### MUSICIANS TO GATHER IN OMAHA NEXT MONTH

The American Federation of Musicians will convene for six days in Omaha, beginning May 27. Delegations from Atlanta, Ga.; Lynn, Mass.; New Orleans and other remote cities have signified their intention of being here. Probably 50 delegates will be in attendance.
