DEATH RECORD. Hans Hansen. NORTH PLATTE, Neb., May 21.—(Special Telegram.)—Hans Hansen, an old settler of this county, died at his home, seven miles north of this city, yesterday from a severe attack of paralysis. Mr. Hansen came to this country forty years ago, direct from Denmark and began as a laborer on the railroad. In a short time he took a pre-emption claim and started farming and stock raising. He was one of Lincoln county's wealthiest farmers. He was 84 years old.

NEBRASKA'S REQUEST GRANTED. Annual Conference Was Given Permission to Unite. MINNEAPOLIS, May 21.—(Special Correspondence.)—The enabling act which the Nebraska delegation to the Methodist general conference was seeking from the committee on boundaries was granted today. The delegation presented to the committee three propositions, as follows: First—A proposition to lift the boundaries between all four conferences in the state of Nebraska, making a state-wide conference.

State Board of Control. The state board of control started today for inspection of the state institutions of northeastern Iowa, going first to Independence. The board has partially solved a problem as to care of certain classes of patients at the Oakland sanitarium for tuberculosis. The law contemplates that only incident cases shall be received or treated there and, this has been taken to mean that where a case becomes chronic it shall not remain. But the board has refused to enforce this rule and will ask the legislature for provision for the permanent care of the incurable cases coming into their charge.

Death Record. John Schmidt. NEBRASKA CITY, May 21.—(Special Telegram.)—John Schmidt, one of the pioneers of this county, died at his home, south of this city, yesterday of old age. He was born in Germany, December 21, 1828, and when a young man came to this country, locating in Omaha, in 1848. In company with his brother, he came to this state and located near this city, where he prospered.
