Two Nebraskans Get Degrees from Iowa

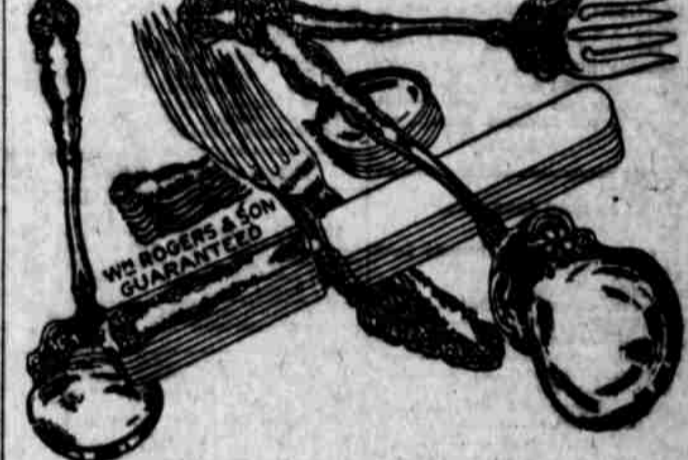
