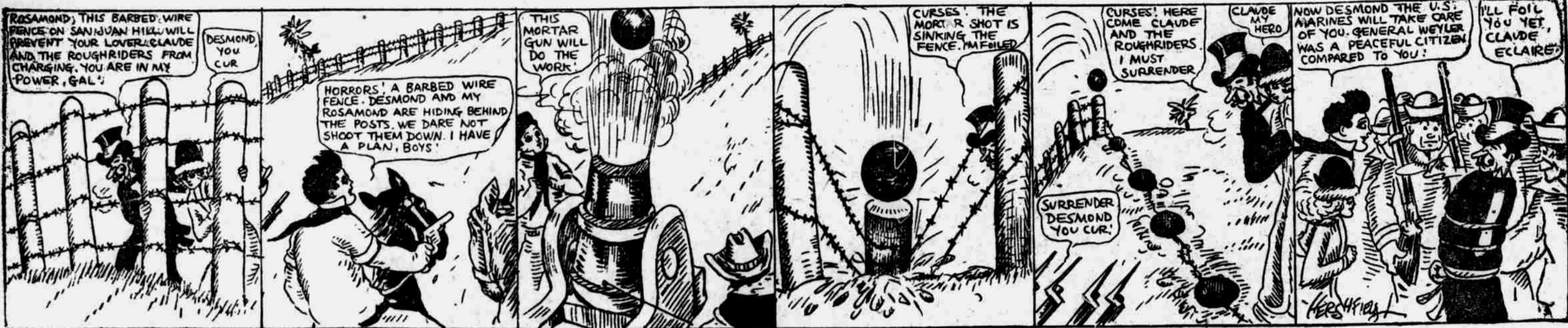


Desperate Desmond
