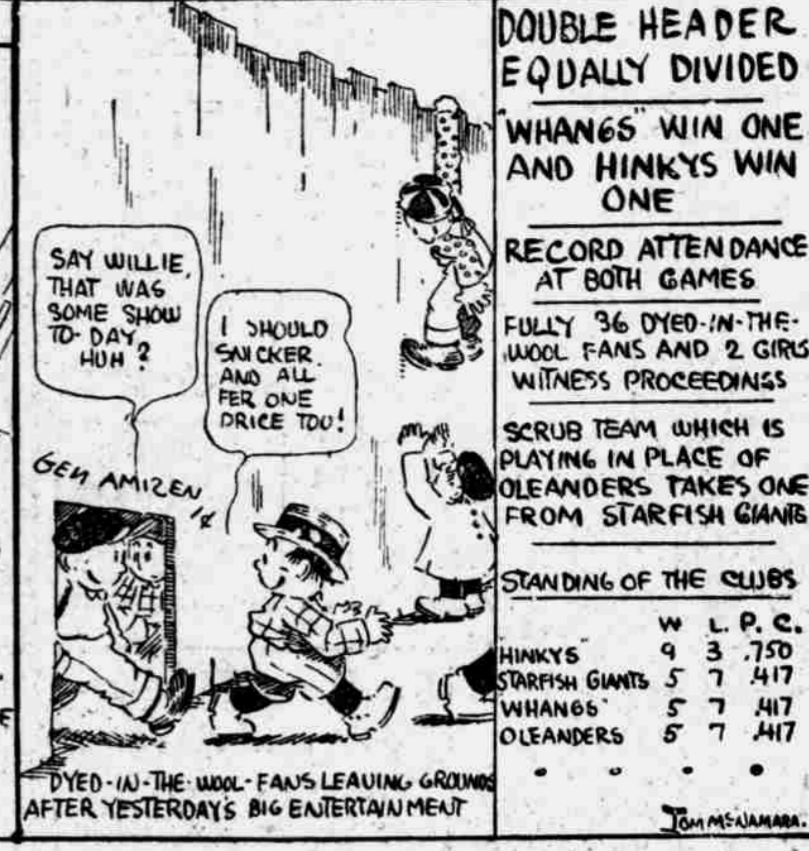




BIG MOMENTS IN YESTERDAY'S GREAT 'HINKY-WHANG' DOUBLE HEADER
