

Nebraska. STATE UNI. GRADUATES Large Class Will Receive Degrees at Nebraska Institution.

ANDREWS DR. OF PHILOSOPHY Former Chancellor Honored by Board of Regents—List of Those Who Receive Diplomas for Four Years' Work.

LINCOLN, Neb., June 11.—(Special)—Former Chancellor E. Benjamin Andrews today received the degree of doctor of philosophy when the regents formally approved the recommendations of the faculty at the annual meeting of the board.

Forty-four of the graduates came from the graduate college, thirty-nine from the law, eight from the medical, twenty-four from the agricultural, forty-two from the engineering, 190 from the academic in the A. B. degree and twenty-one took B. Sc. degrees.
