YOUNG GARDENERS COMPETE

Vegetables Grown by Omaha Boys Will Be Shown Saturday. Gardening on City Lots is Promoted by Young Men's Christian Association to Keep Boys Off the Streets.

The exhibition of vegetables grown by the boys of the Public School garden club will be made in the boys' department of the Young Men's Christian association this afternoon from 12 until 4:30.

Two months ago F. A. Turner of the Young Men's Christian association boys department interested the boys in making gardens. In this manner he devised a scheme whereby he thought a large number of boys would be kept off the streets.

The plan worked well and when planting time came over 2,000 gardens were made by the school boys. As an inducement to keep the boys at work competition was worked into the plan. Prizes were offered for the best exhibits.

Consequently the boys began to work all the harder and today will see some Omaha grown vegetables which will be a credit not only to the boys themselves, but to Mr. Turner. Over 400 exhibits will be on display, including all kinds of garden truck. Premiums are offered as follows:

List of the Prizes. One dollar each for six best exhibits of radishes, lettuce, onions and beets; 75 cents for each for next six best; 50 cents for next six best; 25 cents each for next six best.

Three memberships in the boys' department of the Young Men's Christian association will be distributed to the three who win the most premiums. If a boy under 12 years of age wins a membership it will be reserved until his twelfth birthday. As far as possible it is desired that each boy enter four vegetables, but if this is impossible he may enter as many as he has.

Mr. Turner requests that the mothers turn out to the exhibit and take notice of what can be done by their boys.

Omaha Capital in South Dakota City. "Omaha capital has become a factor in the progress of Aberdeen," said G. W. Smith, real estate man of the South Dakota city. "C. T. Kountze, Fred H.
