HARVARD WINS HARD FIGHT

Yale Freshmen Lose Regatta Race by a Boat's Length.

NEW LONDON, Conn., June 21.—A hard fought victory followed by an easy win were scored by Harvard in the preliminary contests of today's annual regatta with Yale, that will reach its culmination in the varsity race this afternoon. The Harvard freshmen defeated the Yale freshmen by a scant length, or a margin which the timers placed at 2 1/2 seconds. Time 10:32.

Except at the very start, the Harvard shells were always ahead of Yale in both races.

The weather was ideal. There was scarcely a ripple on the upper reaches of the Thames when the four-oared crews slipped into their rowing togs for the forenoon races.

Below, near the start of the first race, at the drawbridge, there was not breeze enough to float the hundreds of blue and red banners and parti-colored signal flags which adorned the yacht masts.

Two score commissioned and warrant officers from three revenue cutters moved about the course in power boats, becoming more and more rigorous with their orders as the time approached for the freshmen race, the first of the day's sporting schedule. The two excursion trains were well filled when they started out for the river banks.

Half an hour before the time scheduled for starting the freshmen race both crews were on board their respective launches bound from quarters for the starting line under the drawbridge, with their shells in tow and the observation trains were preparing to pull out of the railroad station.
