PIKERS BARRED FROM SALE

To Bid on Telephone Property Monday One Must Deposit \$50,000.

MILLION DOLLARS LOW FIGURE

Unless at Least That Amount is Bid Sale Will Be Called Off and Court Will Be Asked for More Instructions.

Unless a man has \$50,000 of ready money in his pocket he simply can't play when the game of selling the property of the Independent Telephone company opens next Monday noon. This, Receiver Abbott says, is to keep out small bids.

The court's decree provides that the special master shall receive no bids from any person who shall not first deposit with him this sum as a pledge that he will make good the bid in case of his acceptance. When the hammer falls the successful bidder will have to fork over

another \$50,000 to make up the \$100,000 required as the spot cash payment on the property.

The total indebtedness of the company is something over \$1,000,000. The court's decree of April 26 ordered that unless the sum of \$1,352,234.39 was paid within ten days the property should be sold. This sum represents only the bonds which accumulated interest. It does not include the receiver's certificates which amount to \$300,000, the open accounts, nor the taxes. Personal taxes due the city of Omaha alone from 1909 to March 1, 1912, with interest amount to \$14,008.08. Personal taxes due Douglas county with interest for the same period \$4,107.87.

Provisions of the Sale.

If a successful bidder at the auction should fail to make the payment of \$100,000 upon the ground, the bid will be rejected and the property offered for sale. In case no bid of as high as \$1,000,000 should be received the sale will be adjourned and the receiver will apply to the court for further instructions.

It is set forth in the decree that bond

holders may be bidders and that they may use their own bonds in purchasing. Upon confirmation of the sale the purchaser must make payment of the balance as the court directs. In case the highest bidder fails or omits to make the balance of his payments within thirty days after the entry of an order requiring him to do so, the court may recall the property. The fund arising from this sale is to be distributed as follows: (a) Costs of sale; (b) costs of suit; (c) taxes, receiver's certificates, mechanics' liens and other preferred claims; (d) bonds and coupons pro rata; (e) unsecured claims.

Outstanding Bonds.

Who holds the greater part of the bonds in the company in not public. The decree mentions "outstanding bonds" amounting to \$2,400,000 with interest at 5 per cent from October 15, 1909, amounting to \$300,000.

Preferred claims secured by bonds, however, are mentioned as follows: The Assets Realization company, \$130,714.12, secured by \$60,000 of bonds as collateral;

the First National bank of Omaha, \$4,382.25, secured by \$12,500 of bonds as collateral; the National Conduit and Cable Co., \$38,410.45, secured by \$120,000 of bonds as collateral.

Claims against the company which are subsequent to the bonds are: The City of Omaha franchise and occupation tax aggregating \$2,918.57; Stromsburg-Carlson Manufacturing company, \$953.44; and Julius Holpand judgment, \$1,488.35.

Pest House is Need of More Repairs

STEWART TALKS PHILIPPINES

Director of Commerce for the Islands Tells of Trade Increase.

ISLANDS ARE VALUABLE ASSETS

New Possessions Are Self-Supporting and Are the Gateway to the Orient—Splendid Opportunity for Trade.

Facts and figures concerning the trade between the United States and the Philippine Islands, the progress the islands have made since this country took possession of them in 1901, and an appeal to the American business man to take interest in the trade possibilities there, were incorporated in a short speech made at the Commercial club by M. L. Stewart, director of commerce for the Philippine Islands.

"The Philippine Islands," declared Mr.

Stewart, "are the greatest asset the American government has. We hear many people say we should not keep them; that they are a bother and an expense. The Philippine Islands do not cost the American government one cent and have cost us nothing since 1901. The islands have \$25,000,000 in the banks and are only \$3,000,000 in debt. We have 8,000,000 people there and we think we are some country.

"When the United States took possession of the country there were no schools except those maintained by the religious organizations; there were only ninety miles of railroad and no telephones except a few lines in the city of Manila. Today there are 2,000 miles of good roads, 60 miles of railroad, 4,700 school houses for the 670,000 school children and the University of Manila, where 1,400 students are enrolled.

"The world approves what the United States has done for the Philippine Islands more than the United States."

Colonel Stewart declared one of the best advantages of the islands to the United States is the fact that they are

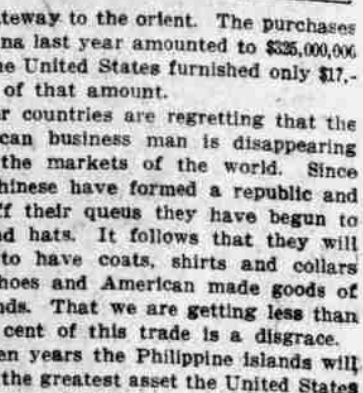
