

GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Predicted Showers Cause Liberal Profit Taking in Wheat.

CORN STRENGTHENED BY CASH

Fine Weather, However, Will Doubtless Offset Bullish Features, as Progress Should Be Made.

Weather conditions were reported clear and warm all over the northwest this morning. Frequent showers and cooler temperature caused liberal profit taking which put the market in a healthy position. If the heavy rains are received, selling pressure will be heavy. Cash wheat and flour business is slow, which is a draw back to further advances.

Strength in corn is due to the strong cash markets, good shipping advice day after day, reports of light selling by option holders and the backward condition of the crop. Fine weather, however, will doubtless offset the bullish features as good progress should be made from now on under these conditions.

Wheat ruled very nervous on conflicting news. Prices were mostly lower and longer took profits on reported showers. Cash wheat was unchanged.

Fine weather and weak wheat gave corn an easier tone. The market is in a strong position, but the price is likely to be only temporary. Cash corn was 1/2c lower.

Primary wheat receipts were 275,000 bu. and shipments were 235,000 bu. and receipts last year of 715,000 bu. and shipments of 288,000 bu.

Clearances were 1,500 bu. of corn, 10,000 bu. of oats and wheat and flour equal to 300,000 bu.
