PA WINS ON BUNCHED HITS

Fourth Straight Game Taken from Antelopes in Brilliant Play.

MUCH EXCITEMENT FOR FANS

Both Teams Play Well, Getting an Equal Number of Hits and Interesting Things Happen Every Inning.

Five well placed hits in the fifth inning gave Omaha the fourth and last game of the series with the Lincoln Antelopes. The score stood 3 to 2.

"Skipper" Bill Schipke started things. He opened the fifth inning with a single to center. It was then that the score was tied by a freak hit. Niehoff was batting and in an attempt to sacrifice Schipke stuck his bat out. The ball glanced off the bat and bounded down the first base line to the right fence before it was stopped. Schipke scored and Davidson hammered in the winning run with a single to center.

Omaha got all its hits in three innings. Two came in the third, five in the fifth and one in the eighth. Robinson kept his hit well scattered. Two hits in the third and three in the fifth gave the Salt Creekers their two runs.

Things looked dubious for the home team in the ninth when Cole opened with a triple to center. A groan went up from the stands, but when Barbour looked up a foul to Scanlon things looked better. Mullen tried hard to hit the ball to the outfield, but the best he did was to send it to Justice, and the latter shot it home getting Cole as he was sliding.

The game was one of the best of the series and was highly interesting to the fair sized crowd assembled. Berghammer, who lost Lincoln the game Tuesday with an error, made up for it yesterday with some of the classiest fielding and throwing seen this season on the local grounds.

Time and again he stopped what looked like perfect hits by hair-raising feats. In the eighth he dived for a liner sent to him by Davidson. He dropped it, but made a quick recovery and threw Davy out at first.

Niehoff played a stellar game for the Rourkes and handled six chances without a boot. Bill Schipke played another errorless game and is playing better ball than he ever did for Omaha.

Lincoln got the first tally in the third inning. With one down Kearney doubled to the center garden. Tuckey was an easy out, Schipke to Scanlon. Berghammer drove the ball to left and Kearney scored.

The Rourkes deadlocked the score in the same inning. Davidson singled to right. Robinson beat out a bunt, and a double play was pulled off perfectly. A squeeze play with Justice at the bat scored Davidson.

The Antelopes assumed the lead again in the fifth. Barbour beat out a bunt. Mullen sacrificed. Barbour went to third on Robinson's error, trying to get him at second, and Tuckey, with a ripping double to left, sent Barbour across the plate.
