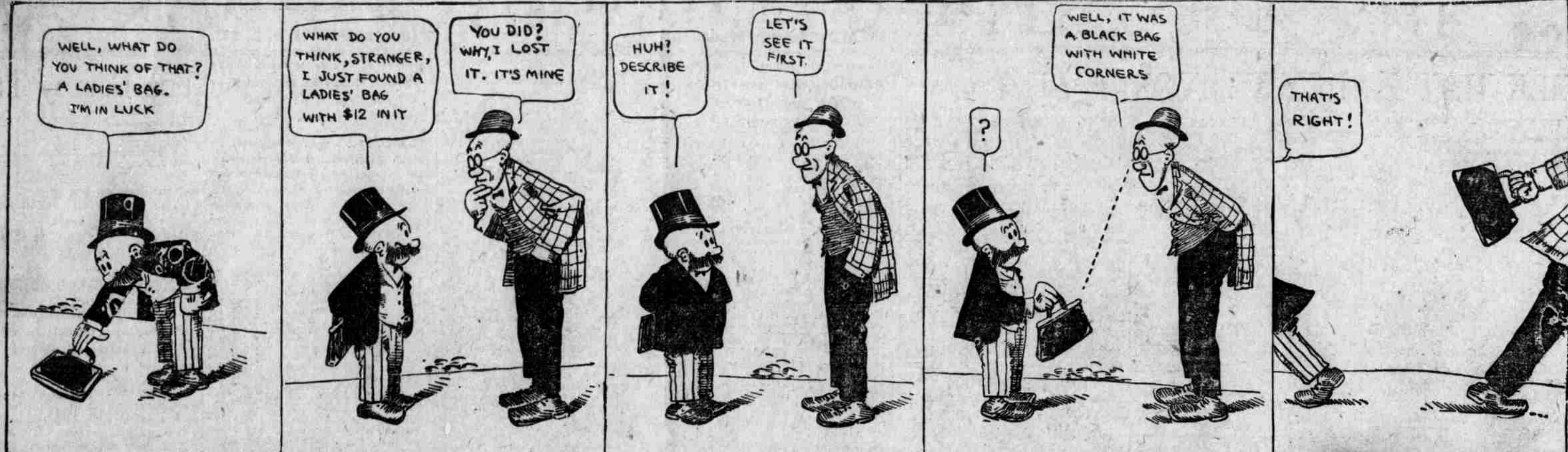

Omaha Takes the First and St. Joseph the Second Game.

ONE SHUTOUT FOR THE ROUKES

Visitors Try Out Sage, Recently Secured from Mink League, While Hicks Does Good Work for Home Team.

Omaha and St. Joseph divided yesterday afternoon's double bill. Harry Hicks won a pitchers' battle from Sage by a 2 to 1 score in the first, and the Joes lunched his on Bills and Beebe and took the second game, 4 to 0.
