New Books

Fiction.
THE RED LANE. By Holman Day. 222 pp. \$1.25. Harper & Brothers.
 The author explains at the beginning that "The Red Lane" he writes about "is neither road or route. It is an institution—it is smuggling."
 It is a fine story, of the romantic sort, told with dash and spirit, with appreciation of nature's beauty and with much

warm human sympathy. There is in it some good character sketching, too, of the Acadian people, notably of Anaxagoras Billedeau, who fiddles his way about the country and becomes a "psychological instrument," through whom a state legislature is moved to justice and their homes are restored to the evicted Acadians. Aside from being a good story, the book will tell its readers much about a little, but interesting, corner of their country, concerning which most of them know nothing at all.

MRS. ELLI AND POLICY ANN. By Florence Olmstead. 120 pp. \$1. Rellly & Britton company.
 The story tells of many amusing things that happen in the crowded family Mrs. Elli tries to bring up under circumstances that would appal a less valiant spirit. Policy Ann—his real name is Policander, because his father is a Greek—is a little boy of uncommon interest; and in order that there may be something for everyone in this little book, a love story has not been omitted.

THE JUST AND THE UNJUST. By Vaughan Kester. 200 pp. \$1.25. Bobbs-Merrill company.
 Although begun long before the popularity of "The Prodigal Judge," the present posthumous novel of its author was completed somewhat later. Where some authors use scenery for their backgrounds, Mr. Kester uses humorous characters; in the present case the Shrimplin family, whose idiosyncrasies would make a book by themselves. The main story, however, concerns the adventures of John North, who is accused of murdering his friend and is almost

hanged for the crime which another committed.

ELSIE LINDTNER. A sequel to The Dangerous Age. By Karin Michaelis. 212 pp. \$1.25. John Lane company.
 This book opens with the deadly monotony of a journey around the world, which Elsie Lindtner and her companion, Jeanne, are taking, begins to pull upon the two women. Jeanne gives up traveling and Elsie Lindtner goes to America. Here, yielding to an unexplained impulse, she adopts a street urchin. Her motherly instincts are awakened, and the child is to her the present and the future.

THE SHERIFF OF BADGER. By George Fattullo. 312 pp. \$1.25. D. Appleton & Co.
 A breezy western story, full of dash and cleverness, which contains descriptions of life in the cattle country and on the big ranches now given over to farming. Incidentally, the love story running through the book is very human and the characterizations are all good.

KINDLING. By Charles Kenton and Arthur Hornblow. 275 pp. \$1.25. G. W. Dillingham company.
 The book follows closely the play of the same name, which Omaha people had the opportunity of seeing Miss Illington present last winter. It is a vivid story which tugs at the reader's heartstrings.

A MAN IN THE OPEN. By Roger Pocock. 282 pp. The Bobbs-Merrill company.
 A story of a life, a story of adventure, a cowboy story, a sailorman's story, all rolled into one, and told partly by the

man himself and partly by his wife. The story has the flavor of a strong and unusual individuality and is always shining and vibrant with life.

MY LIFE IN PRISON. By Donald Lowrie. 42 pp. \$1.25. Mitchell Kennerly.
 Donald Lowrie has written a story of his own personal experience in San Quentin prison that is worthy the perusal of every student and of the public in general. It is valuable first, for its frank and apparently accurate discussion of conditions that pertain within the prison itself. The problems of the prisoners are set forth clearly, as well as the problems of the keepers. The incidents that are recounted are for the main part illustrative of the routine life within the walls, but some are unusual and are therefore told at length. The author gives some reasonable suggestions for the betterment of conditions inside the prison, changes that will not only benefit the men who are confined there, but will be of profit to the state of California. No study of penology can be called complete that does not comprise this book. Its style is simple and lucid, and its author has really done his kind a service.

 The story of a Napoleon of London journalism. A humorous recital of ingenious rascality in the struggle for and achievement of success, marked by life-knowledge, and distinguished by bracing indifference to the temporary flirtations of fortune.
