ROURKES STILL IN THE RACE

Omaha Team Has Fine Chance to Catch Denver by Playing Safe.

DES MOINES HERE TOMORROW

Frank Isbell's Iowa Boosters to Play Series of Four Games with the Rourkes—Double Bill for Sunday Afternoon.

Frank Isbell's Des Moines Boosters are spectators at the game between Omaha and Topeka this afternoon, having an off day. The lads will begin a four-game series with the Rourkes tomorrow afternoon. The four games will be played in three days, a double bill being scheduled for Sunday, the first battle being called at 2 o'clock.

By winning this afternoon's game, the Rourkes will crawl half a game closer to Denver, as the latter team has an off day. This was made possible when the Grizzlies and the Boosters played five games on the last series at Denver and but three were scheduled for the series just completed there. However, a double header was played in two days on account of postponed games.

The Omaha fans are not yet ready to believe that the Rourkes are out of the race for the pennant. Omaha has fifteen games to play and by winning twelve, or even ten of these, would be within a point or two of the Grizzlies, providing that team loses three or four games of the twelve they still have to play. The Bears have four games with the Topekas and eight with Wichita. No one will discredit the ability of the Topeka team and should their pitchers work as good against Denver as they did against Omaha, the Rourkes will be right up in the swim.

Wichita is a tall-end team and the Bears will be overconfident in their ability to trounce the Wichies and consequently get badly left, and by so doing Omaha will walk into the lead. The lineup in tomorrow's game will be:
