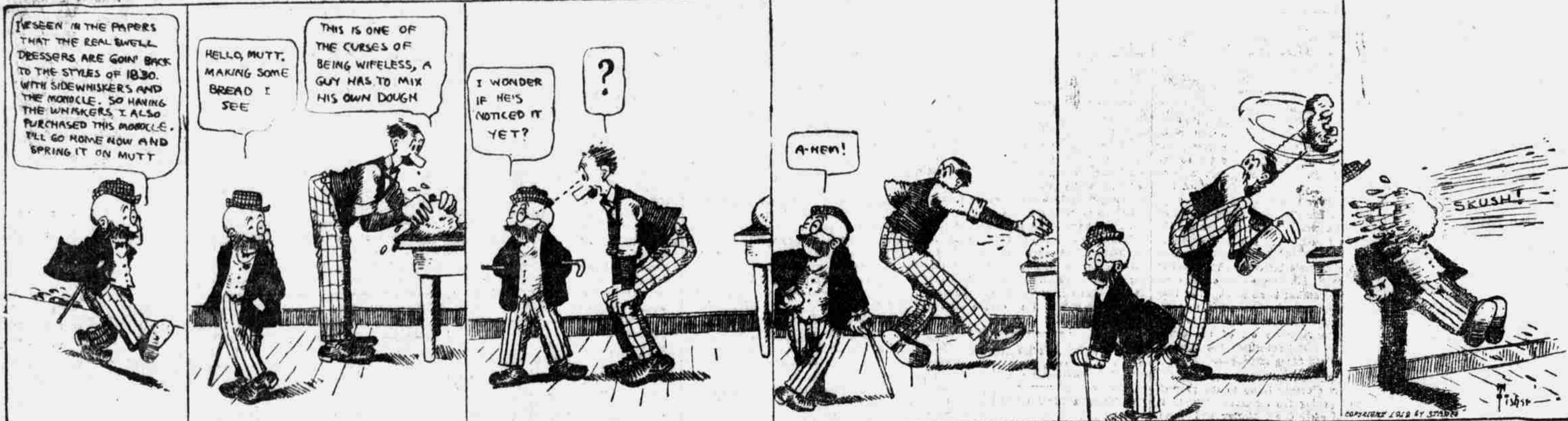

BOSTON TAKES FARCE GAME

Leaders Within One Victory of League Record.

FIFTEEN TO TWELVE IS SCORE

New York Gets Away with Big Lead by Hitting Vanduyke and Adds Runs at Pitcher Pape's Expense.

BOSTON, Sept. 26.—Boston approached within one game of the American league record for games won in a season by winning from New York today, 15 to 12 in a contest that developed into a farce. Boston has six games still to play in which to better the record of 102 games made by Philadelphia two years ago.

New York got away to a big lead by hitting Vanduyke and added runs at Pape's expense. Boston bunched hits in the fifth, sixth and eighth innings and won out. On account of darkness the game was called after eight innings.

NEW YORK, Sept. 26.—New York clinched the pennant here today, when it won both ends of a double-header from Boston. The scores were 8 to 3 and 4 to 0.
