New Books

THE SANCTUARY. By Maud Howland. 128 pp. \$1.25. Lothrop, Lee & Shepard company.
This story is a combination of romance, socialism and theology. Brotherhood is the keynote, and the soul development of three different characters, each along different lines, the chief theme. The daughter of a rich American mill owner meets and loves a millionaire socialist, who in his efforts to solve some of the labor problems, is working as foreman in her father's mill. He teaches her the power of service and of brotherhood which alone can open the door of the sanctuary—peace. A very complicated love situation provides a unique test of these theories; and we are left to imagine that all ends happily.

THE HONORABLE MISS MOONLIGHT. By Onoto Watanna. 115 pp. \$1. Harper & Brothers.
Only Japan could be the scene of this daintily picturesque yet vitally human story, with its charming quaintness of costume and manners, its note of high heroism, and its curious, thrilling drama of birth and death of life and love. Framed in colorful atmosphere that is genuinely Japanese, the appealing figure of the fragile Geisha girl forms a picture of blended pathos and idyllic love.

MY LOVE AND I. By Martin Redfield. 377 pp. \$1.25. The MacMillan company.
Married to a woman whom he idolizes, Martin Redfield tells in his own words of his sad awakening, and of the other woman who came into his life, and how he dealt with the problem which confronted him. The second woman is of noble character, and the solution at which she and Martin arrive is not of the kind usually found in fiction, but middle-aged professor, her father's friend, only to discover that the boy she

A BACHELOR'S COMEDY. By J. E. Buckross. 39 pp. \$1.25. George H. Doran company.
Problems and the city are far away in this book, which is the love story of Andrew Deane, more familiarly known as "Andy," a vicar of a quiet English village. "Andy" is a modest soul, afraid of women, but, despite his fear, got married. A vein of humor runs through the story and the characters are well drawn.

RAM LOYD'S PUZZLES. By David McKay.
This book of puzzles is particularly designed for young folks, there being nothing in the collection that might be considered to be beyond their ability to understand.

THE WOMAN OF IT. By Mark Lee Luther. 24 pp. \$1.30. Harper & Bros.
A clever story, in which some very real and humanly interesting people play their parts in the development of an ingenious plot, which has for a background the social life of Washington—not the brilliant panorama of official functions, but the real every-day social life of the capital with its fussy formalities and glaring incongruities, as seen by the un-

sophisticated wife of a newly-elected congressman.

A ROMANCE OF HILLY-GOAT HILL. By Alice Regan Rice. 64 pp. \$1.25. The Century company.
The sweet, wild little daughter of a down-at-the-heel southern home, finding herself an orphan, all but penniless and unnoticed kindly, marries the kindly, middle-aged professor, her father's friend, only to discover that the boy she

has flirted with and parted from in anger is the one she loves, and always will. Out of this situation grows the story of the book, an irresistible combination of Cabbage Patch humor and high romance.

THE INHERITANCE. By Josephine Daskam Bacon. 38 pp. \$1.30. D. Appleton & Co.
The story is told by the hero, Hugh Gordon, who, at the outset, is a little English boy of mysterious parentage. He is brought to America by his nurse and becomes the protégé of a splendid village doctor. The crisis in his life comes when, upon reaching manhood, he goes to England, where his striking resemblance to the head of a great house causes a nine-days' scandal.

JEAN CABOT AT ASHTON. By Gertrude Fisher Scott. 96 pp. \$1. Lothrop, Lee & Shepard company.
Every activity of a popular girl's first year is woven into this narrative. The story ranks high in the novels of the day upon the studious and intellectual side of college life as well as upon the social and athletic.

OLD FOUR TOES. By Edwin L. Sabin. 26 pp. \$1.50. Thomas Y. Crowell company.
Phil Macowan of the "Bar B" books reappears in this story. He and his friend, Chester Stems, start off on a hunting trip among the tasses, peaks, and precipices of the Lost Park country. Their guide and instructor in woodcraft is the wily and cunning Gizzly bear. This rugged frontiersman shares the

chief honors of the book with another veteran of the wilds "Old Four Toes," a monster grizzly bear. Numerous characters who are old friends of the boys appear in the course of the eventful chapters, including Cherry and her awfully professor of a father.

CLIFF STERLING, STROKE OF THE GHEW. By Gilbert Patten. 39 pp. \$1.25. David McKay.
The third volume in the Cliff Sterling series. Base ball games, water sports and all the interesting events leading up to a sharply contested boat race make up this story.

SKY LAND. By L. Frank Baum. 28 pp. \$1.25. The Reilly & Britton Co.
This book describes the further adventures of Trot and Cap'n Bill, who delighted children in "The Sea Fairies." Everything takes place in the clouds, where many marvelous things happen to the young heroine.

STORIES IN THE WIGWAM. By Gower Glynn. 194 pp. \$1.25. The MacMillan company.
A collection of stories which have been told over and over again to the young Indians gathered around the campfires. Running through them is a fanciful belief in spirits in magic and in the ability of animals to talk and take part in human affairs.
