State House Officials Like Missouri for Vice President.

MORE ROOM FOR THE INSANE

Land Commissioner Reports Old Laundry Building Fixed Up for Reception of Forty New Patients.

Lincoln, Nov. 4.—(Special).—"If I had the selecting of a candidate for vice president to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Mr. Sherman, I would choose Governor Hadley of Missouri," said a state officer this morning.

This same sentiment seems to prevail among most of the men at the state house and little sentiment is expressed in favor of any other man.

However, most of the sentiments expressed were decidedly in favor of the Missouri governor as the most logical man to fill the vacancy.

Land Commissioner Cowles reports this morning that the old laundry building at the Lincoln insane asylum has been fixed up so that it will accommodate about forty new patients which will help considerably.
