SUGARMAN PASSES BOLAND

Twelfth Republican Pulls Through for Representative.

GROSSMAN LONE DEMO IN SENATE

Except for Him Douglas County Will Be Entirely Represented at Lincoln by Men of the G. O. P.

DOUGLAS LEGISLATORS.

State Senators—Dodge, rep. Saunders, rep. Haarfmann, rep. Grossman, dem. Macfarland, rep.

State Representatives—Anderson, rep. Hoff, rep. Brain, rep. Lee, rep. Davis, rep. Simon, rep. Drouesdow, rep. Smith, rep. Flanagan, rep. Yates, rep. Foster, rep. Sugarman, rep.

Final figures show that Martin Sugarman, republican, beat Peter Boland, democrat, for representative, and therefore Douglas county will send to the lower house of the legislature twelve republicans and no democrat.

The returns continue to leave Grossman, a lone democrat, in the senate list, Hancock being the one republican nominee for state senator defeated.

Sugarman's total vote now stands 12,853, Boland's 12,777.

Complete returns from Douglas county, with the exception of two Omaha precincts, give Wilson a plurality of 4,969 votes over the other presidential candidates. In spite of the vigorous campaign conducted by the progressive party, Roosevelt received but 509 more votes than President Taft. The bull moose and republican candidates for president ran neck and neck in the county and in some precincts in the city Mr. Taft received a large majority, while he lost in others.

Morhead, democratic candidate for governor, and Norris, candidate on the republican ticket for United States senator, carried the county by a large majority.

Howard, republican candidate for state auditor, received 573 more votes than his opponent, Henry Richmond.

Loebek has a gain of 278 votes over Baldrige for congressman from the Second district and in all probability will retain this lead in the county, although the two precincts in the First of the Twelfth and the Third of the Seventh, that have not been heard from are considered republican. It is not probable that Baldrige's gain in these two precincts will be more than seventy-five.

Where the democratic ticket lost from 1,000 to 2,000 votes in the county, Diers, democratic candidate for lieutenant governor, received a majority of 487 over his opponent, McKelvey.

Magnay leads Smith by 685 votes for county attorney.

The following tables show the votes received by each candidate in the county, with the exception of the two city precincts that have not been heard from, and their pluralities and majorities. The judges in the Third precinct of the Seventh ward have eighty ballots yet to count. They closed up the booth last night and took the ballots and boxes home with them. In the First precinct of the Twelfth ward the judges worked all night and will be through counting early this morning.
