LABOR FEDERATION IN ROW

Debate Over Plan of Organization Becomes Disorderly.
RADICALS FORCE THE FIGHT

Fortifications defending Constantinople at Tchalatala have received orders to cease fighting and merely to hold the positions they have won, negotiations having begun for the conclusion of an armistice at the request of Turkey.

Third Member of Farrell Family Shot by Chicago Policeman

CHICAGO, Nov. 20.—Irving Farrell, 36 years old, was shot and instantly killed by Policeman John Honan, while resisting arrest in the basement of the Farrell home early today. Farrell was the third of three brothers to be shot by policemen within five months and the second to be slain. His brother Earl was killed by Policeman Williams, colored, on June 21 after he and several companions had attacked the officer. Another brother, Edward, was shot at that time, but not seriously wounded.

Hard Coal Miners Strike Because Men Are Discharged

POTTSVILLE, Pa., Nov. 20.—Because the Lehigh Valley Coal company discharged a number of men and boys for the purpose of retrenchment 4,500 men and boys employed at various collieries in the Mahanoy City region went on strike today and tied up the system. The officials were at the mines when the strike occurred and matters will be speedily adjusted.

Taft is Asked to Pardon C. L. Hyde

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20.—An appeal to President Taft for commutation of the sentence imposed on Charles L. Hyde, a real estate man of Pierre, S. D., convicted of fraudulently using the mails to promote his business, was made today by two South Dakota state officials. Hyde was sentenced to fifteen months in the Leavenworth penitentiary and the payment of a heavy fine. The case is now pending on appeal to the supreme court.

MADISON, Neb., Nov. 20.—(Special.)—According to the expense statements on file in the county clerk's office, Herman Beutrow, candidate for commissioner, spent \$9; Fred Terry, commissioner-elect, \$9; F. J. Hale, senator-elect of the Tenth district, \$15; while Dan McLeod, opposing candidate says that he did not spend anything; M. G. Doering, assessor-elect, \$23.35; Mark Richardson, opposing candidate, has not filed any expense statement; A. J. Koehnstein, county attorney-elect, \$44.75; H. Halderon, who opposed Koehnstein, spent \$79.49; James Nichols, representative-elect of Madison county, \$42.25; and H. C. Haskins, opposing candidate, \$41.
Yesterday afternoon the city council granted a franchise for ninety-nine years to the Western Interurban Railway company, the franchise to be forfeited if the road is not in full operation within three years from the date of the grant. The line enters the city from the east on First street and continues west as far as Water street, which will constitute a terminus of the line.

PLATTSMOUTH, Neb., Nov. 20.—(Special.)—H. M. Soennechen yesterday began the erection of a double store building to be 100 feet long, one story in height and will be adjacent to the Journal building on the west. Mr. Soennechen expects to have the building ready for occupancy next spring.
Mike Mauxy, foreman of the Burlington blacksmith shop in the local shops, resigned his position yesterday. Mr. Mauxy has filled the position for more than twenty years, having worked in that department for a long time prior to being installed as foreman. He will be succeeded by William Wurga.
John Rottor, an employee of the Burlington lumber yard, was seriously bruised about the head yesterday by the upsetting of a car of cinders.

Victim of Hammer Murder is Identified

CINCINNATI, O., Nov. 20.—A photograph of the victim of the Chicago "hammer murder" was identified by Cincinnati relatives today as a likeness of Mrs. Emma Kraft, a woman of 90, who recently sold some property here and who, her kinship believe, was lured to Chicago by someone who planned to rob her of the proceeds of the sale. The local police are looking for a man to whom Mrs. Kraft lent \$500 soon after the sale.

Minnie Hauck, Grand Opera Singer, Dead

NEW YORK, Nov. 20.—Miss Minnie Hauck, former grand opera singer, died in Munich last Saturday, according to word received here last night. She retired from the stage in 1895, spending most of her time at her villa on Lake Lucerne, with her husband, Baron von Hesse-Wartegg.
The baronesse was born in New Orleans sixty years ago, and died on her birthday anniversary. She made her debut in New York in 1868, in "La Sonnambula."
