FORMER SOLDIER SHOT IN BATTLE ON STREET

EXCELSIOR-SPRINGFIELD, Mo., Dec. 1.—In a battle on the principal street here tonight between Fred Boyer, recently discharged from the United States army, and two special policemen, Boyer was shot and fatally injured.

The two officers, Robert King and James Roberts, attempted to arrest Boyer when he appeared on the street with a shotgun across his shoulder and threatened to 'shoot up' the town. Boyer, who is large and powerful, knocked Roberts down and had disarmed the other officer when Roberts shot Boyer through the stomach.

TO IMPROVE WATER SYSTEM

Board Plans to Construct Three New Settling Basins at Florence.

ONE MORE PUMP IS PROPOSED

Big Main Likely to Be Completed This Week, When Hart Street Station Will Be Abandoned as Unnecessary.

Water Commissioner Howell has been informally authorized by the Water board to proceed with the preparation of plans for the construction of at least three new settling basins at the Florence station during 1913, to cost approximately \$20,000 and to have a capacity of 50,000 gallons.

Plan to Clean Basins

There are now five settling basins in use at Florence, one a small basin. The water board believes that at least three others should be constructed to permit frequent cleaning of all.

DODGE COUNTY ATTORNEY FILES MORE AFFIDAVITS

(From a Staff Correspondent.) LINCOLN, Neb., Dec. 1.—(Special.)—J. C. Cook, county attorney of Dodge county, accompanied by ex-Sheriff Bauman, was at the state house this morning, bringing with him over forty-five affidavits from members of the jury.

Most of the affidavits being filed by Mr. Cook show that at the time of the trial no blood stains were in evidence in the suitcase. Among those making affidavits to this are eleven of the twelve jurymen at the trial, the county judge of Dodge county, Attorney George L. Loomis, who appeared for Mrs. Richter, and several bailiffs.
