STATE IS AT WORK ON ITS NEW EXPERIMENTAL FARM

H. B. Howard of the Burlington's land department is back from Curtis, Neb., where he spent several days locating some parties who had bought land.

Mr. Howard reports work progressing well on the improvements being made on the state experiment farm, where a branch of the university is established and where buildings will be erected as soon as the legislative appropriation is made and is available.

Just outside the town limits of Curtis, the state owns 550 acres of choice land, donated by citizens in order to secure the school. This land was purchased at a cost of \$30,000.
