His effort to stop whisky drinking was successful. was his intention as soon as the Omahas were settled in their new home to ask the government to establish ample schools among them to educate the childrep of the tribe by force if they would not send their children by reasonable persuasion. His calculations for the benefit of the tribe were many, but like many other human calculations his life suddenly ended in the prime and just as he was ready to benefit his people and sacrifice a life's labor for helpless humanity." Here was a man worthy of the honor. Why not call the hotel "The Pontanelle."
