

PARCELS POST UNDER WAY

First Deliveries Are Made from the Omaha Office.

EGGS ARE ALL SCRAMBLED

First Delivery is Made to the Brandeis Store and the Second to Hayden Bros.—Auto Used to Make Deliveries.

The first parcels post packages delivered in Omaha were sent out by automobile yesterday. The first one was delivered to the firm of J. L. Brandeis & Sons, George Brandeis receiving for it. The second was delivered to Hayden Bros. and was sent by R. S. McCarthy of Spaulding, Neb.

The parcels too bulky to be handled by the carriers were delivered in the city by automobile. At 10 o'clock Lee B. Lytle drove up to the postoffice in a delivery automobile and loaded up the parcels to be taken out. Little will get no pay for this work as the postoffice has not been authorized to hire automobiles yet, but the young man wanted to do the work and was allowed to do it.

There were big and little parcels. There were parcels smashed and parcels not smashed.

Two dozen eggs coming in a common cardboard box with practically no other protection than that of the cardboard sides of the box came in the shape of scrambled eggs, shells and all. They were not presentable and not "deliverable." The party to whom they were addressed was notified that the eggs were not in shape to be delivered and that if he wanted them he must call at the postoffice to get them. A package of apples was likewise broken open at the end, but carriers were able to deliver this by keeping the right side up.

The outgoing parcels post business was heavy again in the morning. At noon twenty men, women and children stood in line at the stamp window waiting their turn to get their parcels weighed up and stamps ready to mail. They held under their arms everything from shoeboxes to bundles that looked like they contained rolls of dress goods.

The postmaster has frequent telephone calls. Persons are inquiring the cost of sending certain goods weights a given amount to a given station in the United States and they expect the postmaster to answer right off the bat or to take the time to look up the information for them. He usually advises them to come down to the office, when he will furnish them a pamphlet that will give the desired information.

One of the parcels received was addressed to "Mr. Walter Bueger, Omaha, Neb., care of Adams Express company." The parcel was delivered to the express company by automobile.
