

Another provision of the administration bill requires that in case annexation carries a committee of five citizens from South Omaha and as many from Omahah shall then get together and arrange for the merger of the two cities. It is pravided that no one who has not lived for ten years in South Omaha may serve on the committee. Whether this committee was to be appointed or elected could not be found out, because of the jealous care with which the instrument was guarded. At any rate it was generally circulated last night that John B.
