In and Out of the Bee Hive.

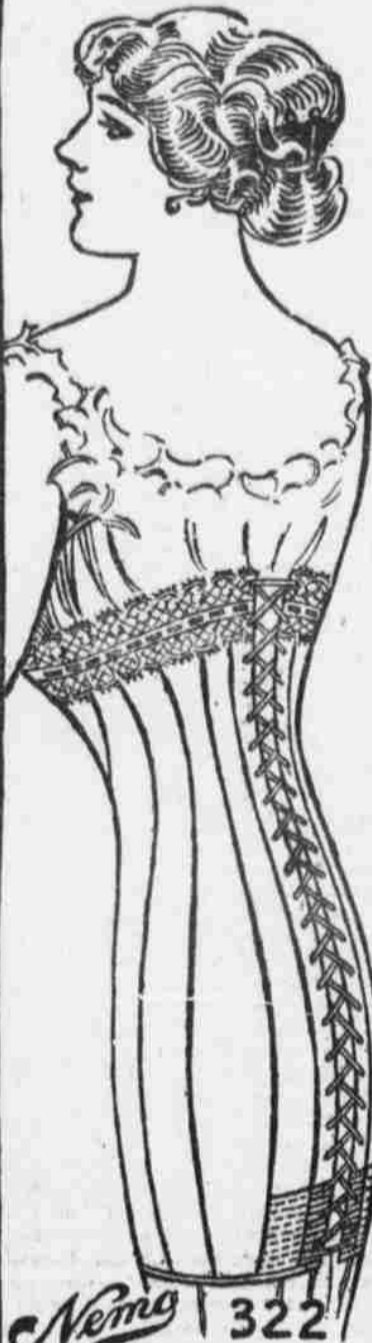
