#### ROSES FOR THE AMATUER

(Continued from Page 4)

They are all strong, vigorous growers and among the hardiest of the garden roses, requiring little or no protection except in most northern climates; a covering of three or four inches of long stable manure over the beds on the apstable manure over the beds on the approach of cold weather being all that is required. This may be spaded under in the spring when the plants also should be pruned, cutting out all old scrubby growth as well as weak, thin branches. The heavy canes, if an abundance of flowers is desired, may be left two or three feet long; but, if fewer flowers of a much better quality are preferred, they also should be cut down to within eight or ten inches of the ground.

#### Climbing or Rambler Roses

Climbing or Rambler Roses

THERE is a place in every garden for one or more climbing roses and their management is so simple that they should be used extensively. All of the varieties noted are extremely hardy and, with the slightest attention, will give an abundance of bloom, from early in June until the middle of July. They require no pruning beyond cutting out old and dead wood and shortening the laterals and canes to make them conform to the space to be covered. covered.

covered.

American Pillar: A single-flowering variety, with blooms three to four inches in diameter, and of entrancing beauty; a beautiful shade of carmine-pink, with a large, clear, white eye, and clusters of golden-yellow stamens. These are borne in immense clusters and the individual flowers last in perfection a long time.

Excelsa: This is a vastly improved Crimson Rambler. Not only richer in color, but a healthy grower; its foliage always remains healthy, of a dark glossy-

always remains healthy, of a dark glossy

present color.

Dorothy Perkins: Double, soft, shell-pink, very free, and lasts in good condition for a long time.

Hiawatha: Another single rose with a brilliancy of color which must be seen to be appreciated. A brilliant ruby-carmine with white center, with a bunch of color with a start of the center.

mine with white center, with a bunch of golden stamens, frequently with forty to fifty flowers on a spray.

Gardenia: The buds of a bright yellow, expanding into cream-colored double flowers on which the petals incurve, not unlike those of the Gardenia or Cape Jasmine, which suggested its name.

Tausendschon: One of the most desirable of climbing roses; a strong, vigorous grower, with fine folinge, producing

orous grower, with fine foliage, producing masses of semi-double, Azalea-like flowers, fully three inches across and of a most delicate and pleasing shade of soft pink when first opening, changing to carmine on the reverse of the petals as the flowers mature.

flowers mature.

The proper time to plant roses, if the plants are perfectly dormant field-grown stock, is in spring, as soon as the ground is in fit condition to work; but in recent years, the more extensive growers have adopted a system of potting up the field-grown plants during the fall and winter months, and carrying them through the winter in cold greenhouses and cold frames. Stock of this class should not be planted until danger of severe frost is over

is over.
