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GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Cash Wheat Friday Proved Dull and Spiritless. Much Corn Goes into the PIT. Scattered Interests Offer Their Holdings of the Yellow Cereal for Profit They Might Realize.

OMAHA, Feb. 8.—The cash wheat market was again dull yesterday with only a few scattered orders, which were filled by interior millers. The seaboard wheat market is dull, and the demand for shipment of grain is not strong.

Scattered interests in the corn trade considered corn into the pit in order to secure profits, as the average price of the crop is about 40 cents, while the big holders of May corn are in a position to make profits to suit their pockets.

Loss of Nearly Ten Millions Cash Shown in Bank Statement. EXPORTS OF GOLD ARE HEAVY. Bankers Predict that in View of Present Conditions Contracting of Credit Probably Will Result.

NEW YORK, Feb. 8.—The change in the money situation was revealed in the bank statement and overshadowed other developments of the day in a financial outlook. A loss of nearly \$10,000,000 cash was shown in the actual balance and a decrease in the amount of loans. Bankers predicted that in view of present conditions contracting of credit probably will result.
