

WILL GIVE SAMPLES AT SHOW

Many of the Exhibitors Will Distribute Products Ready for Use.

WILL DEMONSTRATE PROCESS

Manufacturers at Made-in-Nebraska Show Will Carry Out Schemes for Miniature Plants in Operation.

Many firms will serve cooked and manufactured samples of catables at the coming "Made-in-Nebraska" show and among these are the Iben Biscuit company, which will give out fancy cakes, biscuits and crackers; Paxton & Gallagher, with demonstrations of their coffee and extracts; Skinner Macaroni company will serve macaroni, spaghetti and noodles; Uncle Sam Breakfast Food company will give out their cereals; Loose-Wiles Biscuit company will distribute their biscuits and crackers; F. D. Farmer will show the merits of his coffee and baking powder. The DeLancey Starch company will demonstrate its starches. Some eight or nine milling companies will have flour products on exhibition and will distribute all sorts of good things to eat made of the different brands.

The gas company will operate a miniature gas appliance kitchen and the Marks Bros. Saddlery company will show the finest lines of leather novelties, pocket-books, collarboxes, etc., "made in Nebraska," that will show up with any eastern manufactured goods of this character.

The Byrne-Hammer company has decided to show its lines of overalls, shirts and dresses.

The Omaha Tent and Awning company will have an educational display that should carry with it much fruit for the public. It will take the form of portable houses and tents suitable for tuberculosis camps, lawns, etc.

Not everyone knows, perhaps that some of the finest web suspenders, as well as summer belts for men and women, that can be seen on this market are made right here in Omaha. The Nebraska Suspender and Belt company will demonstrate this to the public, while right alongside of them will be "Omaha made" hats shown by the Omaha Hat company.

It is probable that the Haney Saddlery company, which not only has a plant here, but one in Hastings as well, will show in its 200 square feet of space stamping and methods of making fine saddles.

Paxton & Mitchell company and C. B. Liver company, side by side, as far as their exhibits are concerned, will have two demonstrating booths that will appeal particularly to their fellow manufacturers and to the merchants. The C. B. Liver company will have a space fitted up to resemble a miniature store. Kirkendall company's booth, while not being entirely a demonstrating exhibit, will also be of great interest to the visitors. Every line of men's, women's and children's shoes will have a representation in this booth.

If the plans of the D. J. O'Brien company are carried out, and they no doubt will, they will have girls dipping chocolates and demonstrating the making of candy and will give away samples to the public.

Another demonstrating exhibit will be that of Allen Brothers, who will serve some of the line of goods they make, such as coffee, extracts, etc., in palatable forms to visitors.

Demonstrations by beautiful girls of the Velvetina toilet preparations will form the particular feature of the Goodrich Drug company's display, while directly across the aisle will be goods of more substantial household nature—the Bethany Broom company's products.

The monument making and stone cutting industry will be represented through F. Svoboda, who will have stone cutters present who will show how the monuments are carved and engraved. In fact, there will be so much to see in the manufacturing lines and so many samples given out that the Auditorium, from the time the doors are opened, March 5, to the close of the exposition, March 12, should be a point of great attraction to all people of this vicinity and the state at large. From present reports there will be a great many excursions running into Omaha at that time, and local organizations are making plans to take care of these many visitors.
