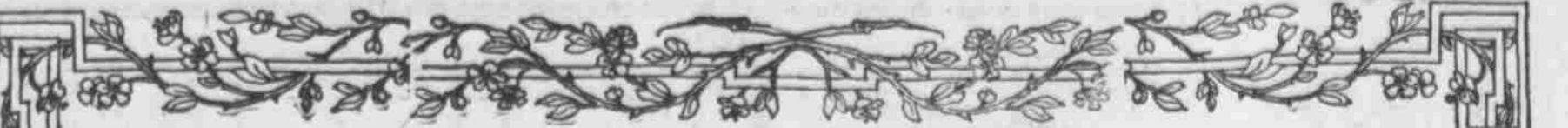
N. P. Bass is to give a demonstration of selling at the Thomas Kilpatrick store on Monday evening at 7:30. He will be the salesmanship class of the night school.
