RETAILERS MAKE THE PROFIT

High Cost Committee Learns of the Grocers' Profit on Butter.

STEWART GIVES THE FIGURES

Retailers Made at Least Two Hundred Per Cent—Packers Fail to Make Money on Storage Eggs.

The presumption always has been that the ultimate consumer of butter has been getting the product at about the actual cost. This, however, is far from being the case, as it was proven before the legislative committee here investigating the high cost of living that butter is one of the most profitable commodities handled by the retail grocer.

The butter, according to Mr. Stewart, goes to the retailer at the price of the Elgin butter board quotation plus 2 cents for wrapping, and he in turn adds about 5 cents per pound to the consumer, a profit of better than 200 per cent per year, as he turns his money as often as once a month, and sometimes three and four times each month.

Block declared that the association did not have a blacklist, but admitted that it maintained a delinquent list, and if a grocer got behind in his payments he went onto this list and could not get goods from any association member unless he paid cash on delivery.

Eggs during 1912, according to Mr. Edwards, went into storage from June to September at an average of 13 cents per dozen. Adding to this there was a carrying charge of 2 cents per case and interest charges of 1 cent per dozen for the time up to January 1, when the rooms should be cleared.
