

### Meat Prices Go Up Each Week; Butter Also Goes Up Cent

Beef has advanced 1 cent and mutton 2 cents a pound again this week. For the last month now a raise of at least 1 cent has been recorded each week, and the butchers' product still seems to be strong on the market. The lowest figures for retail meats are about as follows: Hind-quarters of mutton, 16 1/2 cents a pound; forequarters, 9 1/2 cents; pork shoulders, 17 1/2 cents; pork loins, 17 1/2 cents; hams, 17 1/2 cents; bacon, 17 1/2 cents; 25 cents; pot roast, 16 and 15 1/2 cents, and beef steaks from 17 1/2 to 20 cents a pound.

Butter advanced 1 cent this week, now retailing at 26 cents a pound. Flour, too, has suddenly risen in wholesale price. The advance recorded was 10 cents on the barrel. The price remains at \$1.30 a sack temporarily.

### Practical Joke Brings a Lawsuit

How a practical joke went wrong and resulted in a suit for \$1,000 damages, is recited in a petition filed by Emil Doble against William Uvick, prize fighter, in county court.

Uvick poured wood alcohol over Doble's shoe, it is alleged, and set fire to it with a match. But it happened that there was a hole in the toe of the shoe and the burning fluid flowed over his foot. It is said, and much grief resulted.

Such was Doble's awakening from sleep on March 20 in his rooms over a restaurant at Twenty-fourth and N streets, South Omaha, where he was employed. The plaintiff alleges that he cannot work and that he has endured much suffering.
