



OMAHA LOSES QUEER GAME

Seven Runs in Seventh Inning Without a Hit.

JOSIES WIN, THIRTEEN TO SEVEN

Visitors Are Able to Hit All Four Pitchers Used by Omaha, While Their Three Twirlers Issue Thirteen Passes.

Omaha broke what is believed to be a world record when it scored seven runs in the seventh inning of yesterday's game with St. Joseph without a hit...

It was one of the weirdest exhibitions of base ball which has been seen on the Omaha grounds for a decade. Seven pitchers were used, four by the Bourkes and three by the Josies. The three St. Joseph twirlers gave a total of thirteen walks, but Omaha had fourteen men left on bases. Omaha made two errors and the Josies were credited with three, all of which went to Meikle, the shortstop.

Omaha could not find McConaughy, the former Cleveland twirler. During the six and a fraction innings he was in the box he allowed only four hits, but gave nine walks. On the other hand the Josies hit all four of the Bourkes twirlers. The sixteen hits they must have for a total of twenty-eight bases. Chellette, relieved McConaughy in the seventh and was wild.
