NEW YORK, May 10.—Shackled in pairs—Murtha with Sweeney, Thomson with Hussey—the four ex-inspectors of police, sentenced to one year in the penitentiary and to pay a fine of \$500 each after being convicted of conspiracy to obstruct justice and to check graft revelations involving them, were taken from the Tombs to Blackwell's island, where they reached their cells within five hours from the time they were sentenced.

Music of Band Barbers' Signal to Go on Strike

NEW YORK, May 10.—The barbers' strike which has been in progress in Brooklyn for a week, was carried today to Manhattan, where novel means were employed to get the men out. Three thousand striking barbers headed by a brass band, marched across Brooklyn bridge and paraded along the Bowery to Fourteenth street, gathering recruits. As shop after shop where patrons were receiving shaves and hair cuts was invaded, barbers laid aside razor and scissors and quit work.
