GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Wheat Bears and Shorts Wishing for Heavy Rains. KANSAS OUTLOOK IS A BIG ONE. Concern in Metropolis of That State Estimates that the Harvest Will Total Hundred and Twenty Million Bushels.

OMAHA, May 26, 1913. The wheat bears and shorts of the country are wishing for heavy rains in the southwest in order to help them out of the predicament which they are in. In the annual crop scare, which is now in earnest, will continue to become more pronounced.

It is reported that a pronounced falling off in conditions has been observed in Kansas, which is much larger than it was last year and those in the best position to know say that while there has been deterioration in portions of the state, the present prospect is for a much larger crop than was harvested in 1912.

NEW YORK STOCK MARKET

Opening Prices Reflect Degree of Irregularity. SUPREME COURT A "BEAR". Protracted Open Session Proves Deterrent Factor—Virginia-Carolina Preferred Advances Seven Points.

NEW YORK, May 26.—Disappointment was the portion today of that element of the stock exchange which had looked for a resumption of last Saturday's strong advance. The market was decidedly affected by a degree of irregularity which soon turned to heaviness.

Various conditions and developments were offered in explanation of the day's movement. Chief among these was the fact that the market had been affected by the United States and Southern Pacific demotions, although the chief cause of the decline was the demotion of the Virginia-Carolina preferred.

Another low record for the market was set today. Trading tapered to a slight degree during the afternoon, owing to the current heaviness of the market.
