

DAIRY INSPECTOR REPORTS

Bessie Gives Conditions on Cleanliness of Omaha Dairies.

GIVES BUTTER FAT FIGURES

Says Has Inspected neighborhood Dairies and Finds Small Per Cent of Cows Afflicted with Tuberculosis.

Dairy Inspector Bessie has made his monthly report to the city health department on the condition of the dairies which are supplying milk to customers in Omaha.

The report follows: "In submitting my report for the month of May, upon sanitary conditions of the dairies, I desire to call your attention also to the average butter-fat and bacteria content. I have taken the time to average the samples taken thus far this year of each and every dairy selling milk in Omaha, and set same opposite the scores. In addition to scoring the dairies, I have visited several so-called 'next door' or 'neighborhood dairies' and have made considerable headway in having them put in a sanitary condition as well as having all cows at such places tuberculin tested. In one case only was I compelled to arrest anyone, and in this instance the offender was fined \$50 and costs.

"I desire also to call your attention to the result of the annual tuberculin test, recently completed. Of the nearly 2,000 dairy cows tested, less than 27 per cent reacted, and were condemned, all of which have been removed from the herds. I think it would be advisable to use your influence with the state veterinarian to the end that the dairy cows on all farms that are sending milk into Omaha be tuberculin tested. If this cannot be done I recommend that our ordinance be so amended, in other words, that the farmer who sells his milk in Omaha be made to come up to the same standard of cleanliness and efficiency as other dairymen who must go to a considerable expense to meet the requirements of our ordinance, and compete with farmers who do not even think of keeping their herds or barns clean. In justice and fair play to all, let us try and make some provision other than the temporary welcome aid that our state food commissioner is giving us. We should have some permanent system of farm inspection; our people have not yet begun to realize the ever importance of a clean milk supply. A partial verbal report of the state inspector now working among the farmers of this section would startle anyone. I insist that we need permanent inspection, and I hope that you can see your way clear to try and secure same. Possibly some provision could be made in the new charter to set aside a certain amount for this purpose. Think it over. I am ready to assist you.

Mrs. Wilson managed to escape to a neighbor's, where for several hours she suffered from a hemorrhage of the lungs. Friday she stayed from work on account of the trouble and Oberley returned, threatening to cut first her throat and then his own. This time the woman jumped from a window and summoned the police, who took Oberley to the station. At the time of the incident the Wilson woman stated that her name was Mrs. Elise Tome and Oberley, who gave the name of Tome, was booked for beating and abusing his wife. The Wilson woman has run away several times, but on each occasion he has followed and made trouble for her.
