Americans Defeat Australians in Fourth Match of Series.

WIN RIGHT TO PLAY GEMMANS Maurice E. McLoughlin Defeats Stanley Doust in Three Games Straight, Clinching the Victory.

McLoughlin's Service Severe. The severity of McLoughlin's service and returns caused the downfall of Doust. The visitor was unable to handle the ball propelled with such terrific speed in a manner suitable for consistent placing...

Doust Wins Opener. McLoughlin and Doust came upon the court at 1:15 p. m. Doust took the play with a service which McLoughlin netted on return. Doust won the opening game, 4 to 2, on nets and outs by his opponent...

Australian Helpless. The American champion cut loose with a sweeping service in the sixth game, which ailed and threw Doust out of position until he was helpless, losing 1 to 4. Doust, by playing to McLoughlin backhand, won the seventh game, 4 to 1. With the wind at his back, the Californian easily scored a love game in the eighth, the match game being 4 to 0.

McLoughlin's return was a score of 4 to 1. McLoughlin found it difficult to return the Australian's long punning service and outs. McLoughlin took the tenth game, 4 to 1, and the first set, six games to four, by forcing Doust to all parts of his court by his vicious slashes. Score first set:

Doust won the second set to the net in the first game of the second set and by clever cross court play of McLoughlin's returns, won 4 to 1. The American adopted the same tactics in the second game and won, 4 to 1. The play was fast and hard in the third, which was won by Doust, 4 to 1. Both players fought hard for the visitor succeeded in winning the place and point. McLoughlin easily won on his service in the fourth game by a score of 4 to 1.

Man Crushed to Death UNDER A LOCOMOTIVE.
