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NEW YORK STOCK MARKET

New Low Record for Midsummer Dullness Scored.

WHEAT AND CORN OPTIONS UP

In Early Dealings Leaders Like Amalgamated, Reading and Canadian Pacific Fall, but Generally Recovered.

NEW YORK, Aug. 3.-A new low record for midsummer dullness was scored by the stock exchange today. Total business for the two hours approximated 61,000 shares, compared with 64,000 shares on July 11 last, that day breaking all low records for something like sixteen years.

The market was without its usual guide, as London was observed one of its frequent holidays and continental exchanges were lifeless. About the only interesting news was contained in dispatches from western and southern points to the effect that the Treasury department's plan for helping the movement of crops was meeting with favor.

Wheat and corn options were higher as a result of the unbroken drought in the southwest, although no news was reported from Texas.

In the early dealings, leaders like Amalgamated, Reading and Canadian Pacific fell, but recoveries were established in most instances. Canadian Pacific more than regained its loss. Steel was the only issue in which dealings approached the normal, a block of 500 shares changing hands at a price midway between the low and high.

The feature of the bank statement was the actual loss of about \$4,000,000 where a gain was expected. The loan increase was nominal, while reserves were reduced by \$1,500,000.

Bonds reflected the apathy shown by stocks. United States 2s and Panamas 2s advanced 1/4 per cent on call during the week.

United States 2s and Panamas 2s registered decline of 1/4 per cent, and Panamas coupon 2s per cent. Total bond sales, par value, were \$49,000.
