CHICAGO, Ill., Sept. 2.—Bellef that France would be obliged to purchase liberally from the United States had much to do today with causing an advance in wheat. The market closed steady at annet advance of 1404675c. Corn finished with a gain of 146755c, cats up 160 decline to a rise of 16c.

Firmness of cables and lighter deliveries than expected gave the wheat bulls aid from the start and prevented any important reaction. Advices were at hand that the European crop as a whole would be only moderate at best. In this connection it was pointed out that field conditions in Argentina had not been favorable for seeding, and that South American competition with the United States would be minimized to that extent.

Sharp falling off in primary receipts tended to strengthen builtsh sentiment regarding wheat. The total arrivals were but little more than half those of a year zgo, and the two southwestern terminals received less than one-third as much as at the corresponding time last season. A decrease in the visible supply was another element of strength and so also was large export clearances.

Reports of havoc from unseasonably dry hot weather sent corn to new high price records for the season in the December and May options. Absunce of September deliveries called attention forefoly to the very light stocks so that heavy selling at the advance falled to bring about any decided setback.

Oats went higher than corn, despite a rise for September of 2,000,000 bushels. The volume of trade was large, principally changing of other holdings to December. In provisions, the main feature was the selling of nearby and the purchasing of deferred deliveries by September longs. There were very heavy deliveries of lard and ribs, a fact which weakened both those commodities but did not affect pork.
