Level in the Wheat Pit. CORN HAS BETTER SUPPORT

Wenther Predictions of Rain Followed by Colder Weather Induce a Rather Stiff Market Tendency.

OMAHA. Sept. 24, 1913.

The sharp decline late in yesterday's session, under somewhat panicky feeling in the open market, and certain bull leadern in the Chicago trade unloading holdings as fast as possible on the declining market, established a new low level of prices for the year. In a way the Chicago trade was under a strain because of bearish conditions in the northwest and abroad. An effort was made on the part of buil leaders to check the declining tendency during the morning with some success. The forecast of general rains for today helped buyers a little, but the very heavy movement of wheat to northwest markets was a bearish feature which could not be avoided. On top of this, about midday came the Bradstreet's figures, showing about 15,000,000 lushels increase in the world's stocks the last week. There was a rather sharp break in the cash wheat here in Omaha. Northwest measages declared that Duluth must soon hedge increasing stocks in the Chicago market. The solling pressure became so great and the decline so pronounced that whent came into the market on stop orders all the way down. The giving up of the fight by a large builtsh element in the Chicago trade, coupled with the depressing figures on northwest movement and world's stocks, turned the entire trade to a large extent to a bearish view of the market.

Cash wheat was 14c to 3/c lower.

Fairly good support was noted in corn futures during the morning yesterday, influenced, no doubt, by the predictions of wet weather for nearly the entire country, to be followed by still coider weather than before. Traders say that the corn market is almost certain to drag lower in case of a further break in wheat. They claim a level may be established in the near future, where it will do to take hold of corn on the buying side for a long pull.
