Giant Guard Enters Foot-Ball Game for Season at Nebraska. CHANCE TO BEAT GOPHERS Scout Harmon Says Minnesota Should Have Beaten Dakota by Big Score, but Were Unable to Do So.

LINCOLN, Oct. 1.—(Special.)—Nebraska foot ball stock mounted higher today when it was announced that Clint Ross, the giant colored guard, of that team, would again don the mole skins. Ross is badly needed in the line, where his experience, weight and ability would add materially to the Nebraska defensive play.

Ross did stellar work in three big games last year, but was not given a letter through a technicality, in the Missouri Valley rules. Ross has overlooked this and consented to return to the fold.

High School Games With Des Moines and St. Joseph Changed

Quite a bit of misunderstanding has arisen at the high school in connection with the recent changes made in the foot ball schedule. The original schedule provided for a game with West Des Moines High school and St. Joseph High. Last week it was announced that these games had been cancelled and that the local high school boys would play Blair and Norfolk instead. No reason for the change was given by Prof. C. E. Reed of the school, who arranged the schedule, and the report became current among the student body that the games had been cancelled because of the expense involved in bringing the teams to Omaha. As a result much comment was caused concerning Mr. Reed's action.

Upon being interviewed Mr. Reed explained that it was a great disappointment to him that it was necessary to cancel the games with St. Joseph and Des Moines, and that he had done all in his power to retain them. For some reason or other, foot ball as a branch of school athletics has been discontinued at the St. Joseph High school this fall, and this, of course, eliminates a contest with that school.

In the case of the Des Moines school Mr. Reed asserts that the contract for the game was broken by the foot ball management of that place without rendering notice to the athletic board of the local school and that he was not notified of this affair or of the St. Joseph proposition until such a late date as to preclude the staging of a contest with any of the larger towns in the vicinity.

The game, which was scheduled for Saturday with South Omaha High school, will be held Monday, because Rourke park is being used this week by the Ak-Sar-Ben.
