

MIGHTY GRIP OF SIXTEEN MEN

They Control All of the Eastern Railroad Systems and Their Subsidiartes.

Asserting that sixteen prominent finantiers hold nine large eastern raliway systems and all of their subsidiary panies in uniformity of action, and likewise serve as a means of communicating policies among them, Dr. Frank J. Warne, statistical witness for the trainmen and onductors, precipitated a lively debate before the Railroad Board of Arbitration at the Hotel Manhattan, New York.

Dr. Warne declared that twenty-nine interlocking directors of the New York Central and its subaidiary companies hold 171 positions in railroads in the eastern territory involved In the present concerted wage movement; that thirty-three such directors of the New Haven system hold 167 positions; that twenty-eight Pennsylvania directors occupy ninety-one directorates and that twenty-cight man fill 114 places on the Baltimore & Ohio boards.

"The result in brief," the witness continued, "is that sixteen men hold nine large railway systems and all of their subsidiary companies in uniformity of action and serve as a means of communicating policies among them. These sixteen men occupy forty-two different posttions in the New York Central, Pennsylvania, New Haven, Baltimore & Ohio, Delaware & Hudson, Delaware, Lackawanna & Western, Reading, Erie and Pero Marquette systems. These same sixteen men occupy seventy-nine other different positions in subsidiary companies of these systems-a total of 121 separate directorships. The numerous positions held by them in companies subsidiary to the systems can be ascortained by reference to preceding exhibits which I have

placed in evidence. "If we select from among the different

systems the individual directors who ocsupy more than five different positions we find twenty men serving as 171 directors. These more important directors, with the number of positions held by each, are as Positione Held follows:
