

CORN IS TO BE REGRADED

Government Proposes to Make Six Instead of Four Standards.

MEETING AT NEW ORLEANS

Local Grain Men Among Those Who Are Now Thrashing Out the Issue Down in the Southern Metropolis.

The proposed regrading of corn by the federal government is attracting a great deal of attention among the grain men of Omaha, as well as the grain men of most every section of the country.

Those who went from Omaha are J. W. Holquist, president of the exchange; George B. Powell, chief inspector; E. A. Beardsley, E. P. Peck and Frank Cowgill.

The rules governing the grading of corn with regard to percentage of moisture now provide four grades, while the tentative grades for corn as formulated by the United States Department of Agriculture, through its office of grain standardization, provides for six standards.

Chief Inspector George B. Powell of the Omaha Grain Exchange has prepared a comprehensive address, which he is to deliver at New Orleans Wednesday.

He further says: "The narrowing up of moisture per cent and the additional extra grades, and the taking from the present grades as well as the tentative grades all of the impurities would force the first buyer down to a 'sample proposition' in buying corn during the present season of a crop, and always during the germination period.

He calls attention to the fact that the grain men of the country have contracts for millions worth of corn to be delivered for December and January, and says it might mean serious losses if the proposed grades go into effect now.
