GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Wheat is Thought by Many to Be at Its Lowest Ebb in Price.

EXPORTS ARE TIGHTENING UP

Countries that Have Been Shipping Out Cereals Are Holding Down Their Sales in Anticipation of Higher Levels.

OMAHA, Oct. 20. 1918.

From the conditions and circumstances surrounding the wheat market the low price of that grain has possibly been seen for a time, at least, is the opinion of some of the most conservative men in the trade. The fact that there were liberal takings of cash, not only in the United States, but in Canada on the recent decline, and that flour sales at Minneapolls and other points were on an enormous scale, shows that the most conservative men in the trade believe that wheat is worth the present price level. Such men as John Washburn of the Washburn-Crosby company of Minneapolis, B. A. Rekart and other Chicago milers advance the opinion that wheat is cheap and that there is a likelihood of the spring wheat sellings to a much higher level. The people who have been selling the wheat at Minneapolis have now changed their front and the expectation is that long lines will be taken in on that market, as the cash artice is expected to bring a premium over the Chicago grain before snow files.

The exporting countries are tightening up on their wheat. Even Russia is asking higher prices for the grain which they are now holding in the interior as well as at ports. The Argentine wheat is about all cleaned out, yet Australia is selling goodly amounts and Canada and the United States are willing fo sell at higher levels. India will not be in the market as an exporter for some little time, or until there is a complete change in crop conditions in that country, when freer offerings will be seen. Exports of breadstuffs from the United States during September as officially reported by the government were 11.476,000 bushels. Chearances of wheat and flour were 2,659,000 bu.; corn, none; oats, none.
