AFFAIRS AT SOUTH OMAHA

City May Have to Pay Income Tax on Its Bonds Sold in New York.

OFFICIALS MUCH SURPRISED

Content that Holders of Securities Should Absorb the Charge and Will Take Legal Advice.

Members of the city administration including City Treasurer Martin and City Clerk Wheeler, are in somewhat of a quandary as to the effect of the new income tax law on the city bonds and the interest paid on them by the city.

Both the city treasurer and the city clerk are opposed to the city paying an income tax upon bonds held by others. The municipal bonds, say attorneys, cannot be taxed under the income tax, nor can the bonds of held by those whose annual incomes are under \$1,000.

It is contended by the clerk and treasurer that if the holders have over a \$1,000 annual income they should pay the tax themselves. The matter will be taken up with the legal department of the city, it is understood.

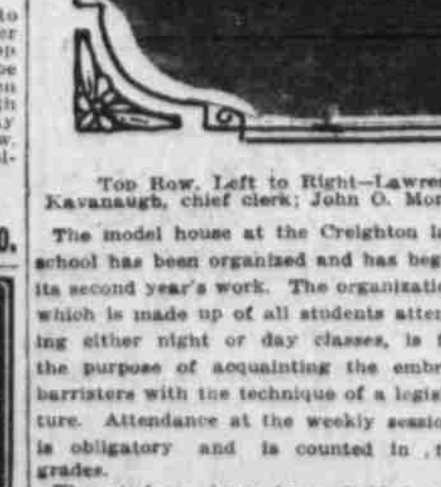

Seventeen Hundred Voters of Omaha and Vicinity Sign Petitions.

LISTS OF NAMES HANDED IN

City Central Committee Meets and Report of Work Accomplished is Made Public—On to Lincoln, the Cry.

Omaha suffragists will attend the Nebraska Suffrage association meeting in Lincoln next week and with them they will take the signatures of 1,700 voters of Omaha and Douglas county, who have pledged themselves to give the women of Nebraska the ballot.
