MOVIES OF EXPO BUILDING

Details of Machinery Building in Construction to Be Shown.

ERECTED IN EIGHTY MINUTES

Camera Stationed So as to Take a Picture Every Five Minutes During Three Months of Construction.

One of the most novel uses to which a moving picture camera has been employed is to record actual progress in the construction of a building erected upon a time contract. Details in the construction of the Palace of Machinery, a huge building on the site of the Panama-Pacific International exposition, to be held in San Francisco in 1915, are recorded by a moving picture machine set to take a picture automatically every five minutes. The camera is placed upon the roof of one of the completed exhibition buildings and has an inclusive view of the new structure.

Under the magic influence of the "movies" a full grown building will be conjured up, beginning with the bare ground and finishing in eighty minutes with a structure completed to the topmost pinnacle. Like the temple of Solomon, it will be built without the sound of a hammer. The pictures will be shown all over the world.

The records will show ninety-six pictures for each working day, or a total of 6,312 for the three months required for completing the building. When the pictures are reproduced the reel will be run at the rate of 964 pictures per minute, or more than week's progress in that time. In eighty minutes, therefore, the entire building will be seen to be assembled.

This is a new departure from the usual custom of taking photographs of buildings at different stages of construction, and aside from the interest of the picture it will furnish the exposition officials with a valuable record of the building operations, as they expect to study the effectiveness of various methods of construction through the slower reviews of the films.

Machinery Hall will be the largest wooden frame building in the world; more than 7,500,000 feet of lumber will be used in its construction, and more than four carloads of nails; 1,300 tons of steel and iron will be used. The dimensions of the building are 967 feet long, 367 feet wide, extreme height 135 feet, with three great naves running throughout its length.

Notes on Panama-Pacific Exposition.
The state of New York has appropriated \$200,000 for its building at the Panama-Pacific exposition.

The many colored prisms that will be used in the novel and striking scheme of night illumination of the Panama-Pacific exhibit palaces are of fine cut glass made in Austria by process not followed elsewhere. The prisms, known as jewels, are patiently toolled by hand in the homes of the artisans.

The yacht harbor on the waterfront of the Panama-Pacific International exposition is about five acres in area and has such ample and convenient docking facilities that coastwise steamers and other craft, sometimes six or seven at a time, use it daily, discharging building material.

The road systems of the Panama-Pacific International exposition will form a part of an artistic color scheme. A material that will be widely used will be the "red rock" indigenous of California, the rich tint of which will lessen the glare and add to the warmth and color of the grounds.

There will be several kinds of intramural transportation for carrying visitors to any part of the grounds of the Panama-Pacific International exposition. In addition to motor buses which will take a passenger to any point for 3 cents, there will be a double track miniature railroad, which will give a four-mile ride for 10 cents; electric jitneys, push chairs and bicycle chairs, the charges for which will be moderate.
