Jealousy Causes Woman to Shoot Man and Herself

BALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Jan. 10.—(Special Telegram.)—Jealous because of the attentions he had paid Mae Dunbar, a clerk in a local department store, Marie Arthur, also known as Marie Jones, shot and killed Frank "Broadway" Jones of Elsie, Neb., in their room at a local hotel this afternoon.

According to the Dunbar woman, over whom the shooting occurred, she met Jones about a year ago while Marie Arthur was in Topeka, Kan., visiting her family there.

"Whatever you do, tell my people that I am heartbroken because I have disgraced them," said Marie Arthur, as she was about to undergo an operation for the extraction of the bullet.
