Omaha Men to Have Big Concession at Frisco Exposition

Charles Mueller has just returned from the Pacific coast, where he, together with his father, Fritz Mueller, and his brothers, Otto and Fritz, Jr., are working up the reproduction of old Nuremberg for the Panama exposition. The Muellers are Omaha residents, but have spent a great many years in the catering business at various expositions. Their success in this line has been phenomenal, and their reputation as experts has spread throughout the entire world. At the San Francisco exhibit the Mueller family are investing approximately \$200,000 on their two concessions. They are now constructing a reproduction of the quaint old German town, Old Nuremberg, which they say will be complete in those details which have made that old town famous. The genuine Bavarian band, the Tyrolean singers, the chefs and waiters, the flower girls, the menus, in fact, everything has been secured to make the reproduction complete.

Thousands of Nurses to Hold Congress at Panama Exposition

Dr. Helen Parker Criswell, president of the International Association of Nurses, has announced that nurses from all parts of the world will hold a world's congress in San Francisco on the grounds of the Panama-Pacific International exposition in June, 1915, to which there will be 4,000 accredited delegates. Four congresses will meet—the International Association of Nurses, representing fifteen foreign nations, including England, Ireland, Germany, France, Belgium, Italy, Australia, China, Cuba and others; the American Nurses' association, with 2,000 members; the National League of Nurses' Education, with 12,000 members, chiefly teachers and superintendents of training institutions; and the Organization of Public Health Nurses. The California State Nurses' association will act as hostess to the visitors.

"The attendance from European countries will be enormous," said Dr. Criswell, recently. "These organizations are uniting in preparation of a comprehensive exhibit of all modern hospital appliances, besides an historical exhibit, a model mortuary and demonstration wards. The exhibits, including a demonstration hospital, will continue the ten months of the exposition." The American Red Cross will hold a congress at about the same time.

WILL HAVE UNIQUE CAFE AT PANAMA EXPOSITION

Visitors to the Panama-Pacific International exposition in San Francisco will be given the opportunity of eating off the shelves of Mother Hubbard's cupboard. In Frederic Thompson's "Toyland Grown-Up" concession, the famous cupboard, no longer bare and grown to the height of eighty feet, will house a five-story restaurant—one story to each shelf. Mother Hubbard, 79 feet high, and her dog, 39 feet high, will stand in front of the cupboard, which will be entered by passing in through the lower panels of the enormous door to the bottom "shelf." Stairways will lead to the higher "shelves." Lining the back of each "shelf" will be giant plates, 30 feet in diameter. On one shelf visitors may dance over a huge "plate" 150 feet in diameter. Tables will surround this dance floor and will fill the space of other "shelves," and refreshments and meals will be served.

ARKANSAS CHILD IS NOT CATHARINE WINTERS

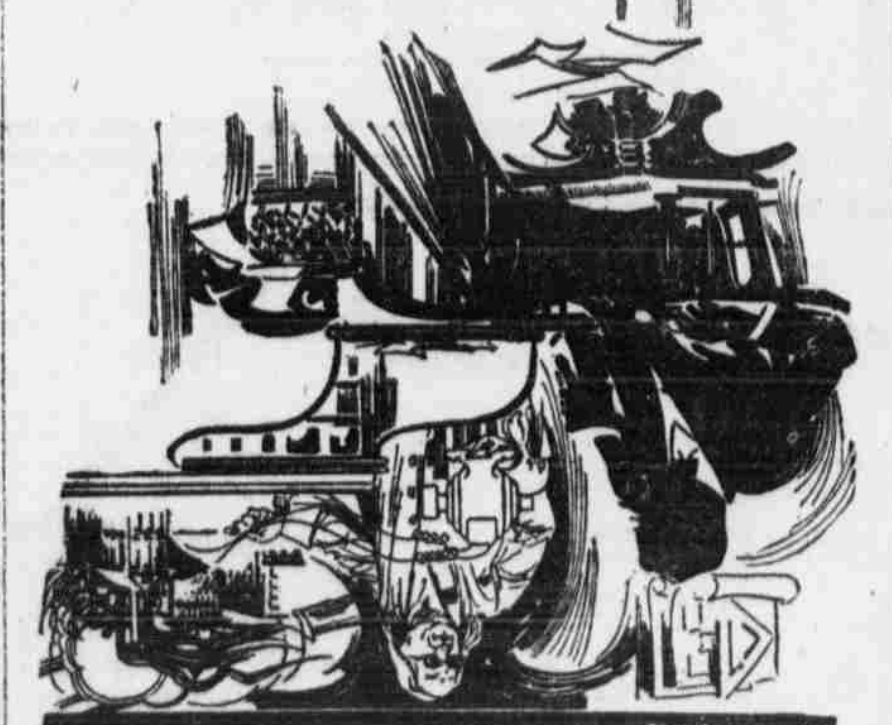
